# PET DAY Tuesday 4th November



Vetco Wyndham & Districts Pet Day 2025

"Horses"

Information for Parents/Caregivers/Children

To be held: Tuesday 4th November with judging commencing at 10am. Venue: Wyndham A & P Showgrounds Theme: Horses

All children must attend Pet Day as it is a school day. The likelihood of this day being postponed is extremely unlikely, in other words, be prepared for PET DAY being on! There has never been a postponement date due to the fact that a lot of effort goes into getting entries ready; people take time off work etc. If the weather is not urable, the day is 'short and sweet' and some outdoors events will be cancelled including the Grand Parade. Most of the entries are located inside a building and there is enough shelter around the venue.

In the unlikely event that Pet Day is cancelled, each school will communicate this via text message in the usual way,

To cover Health & Safety requirements for this event we need all students to attend with a parent or adult to supervise them as all staff are involved with organising and judging and we need to ensure that the students and animals are safe. (We appreciate that this is difficult when you are working therefore are happy for this ominate) Please ring the school if your child is not attending as this is classified as a school day and the roll will need to be marked accordingly.

Entries are to be handed to your teacher no later than Thursday 16th OCTOBER. Your school may want them back earlier; please check your school's newsletter

Only one entry is compulsory with a second entry being optional.

So, children may enter ONE pet &/or ONE other non-pet entry <u>OR</u> TWO non-pet entries if they wish; no child will have

Below is a list of choices for your entries:

Lamb/Goat Cat Dog (Yrs 4-8) Dog (Yrs 4-8) Pony Sandsaucer (Preschool and Yrs 1 & 2 only) Poultry Other Pet

Recycled animal Science/Model Floral arrangement (Yrs 1-8) Needlework Baking - Large Cake (Yrs 3-8 only) Baking - Muffins Baking - Biscuits (Yrs 3-8 only)

Please note: The age restriction for Dog entries. Age of child and dog dosing certificate will be strictly checked and dog sent home if not complying.

If you have a Pet entry, please have that judged first before your second entry (if you have one). If there are too many people waiting for their pets to be judged, you will be directed to go and have your second entry judged first (if you have one).

ART – the only artwork to be entered will be done at school based on this year's theme, Horses. Each school will be responsible for displaying this during the Working Bee on the day prior to Pet Day.

Each child must wear a NAME tag. This makes it easier for the judges and stewards. The label should have: child's

There is no set lunch break. You have lunch when you have a suitable break. The Pioneer Lions will have salad rolls. pies, tea & coffee, drinks and ice cream for sale. The 'Mad Cow' coffee van will be on site too. There will be a free BBQ available for the children ONLY. Please support the Lioness' who sell delicious food or feel free to bring your own picnic lunch.

VETCO SASHES: each child who participates at the Pet Show will receive a sash for their efforts. This can be collected after judging from the Secretary's office.

A gold coin donation or can of pet food for the SPCA can be left in the barrel at the gate as you enter the grounds.

#### Information about Entries

#### Pet entries

Dogs will not be judged without a current dosing certificate. Anyone who is taking a dog to Pet Day will nee to the vet and get their dog dosed and get a certificate. This needs to be done at LEAST THREE DAYS PRIOR TO PET DAY. All dogs over three months must have a certificate. The dog dosing certificate is to be with the child & dog on Pet Day. Parents are to be responsible for their children around the dogs. Please come prepared to clean up after your dog. No dogs to be taken into the Cat area.

\*Horses. No horse is to be ridden by anyone other than the owner

\*No Feral noxious animals. i.e. wild rabbits, deer, opossums, wild rats or mice

Dog Trials: Lead dog around and over obstacles as fast as they can. There will be no tolerance of dragging dogs etc.

Lamb Drinking Races: Bring made up and ready to go: 200mLs milk with normal sized holes in the teats; these will be

Floral: Sand saucers are for Preschool & Years 1-2 only

Models: No Lego (or similar) or kitset models allowed

Baking: Only 3 muffins, biscuits or pieces of slice on a small plate Large cakes and Biscuits can only be entered by Years 3-8 No tasting of the baking

Fancy dress: Any animal can be entered in this section

No one is to remove anything from the craft or baking displays until the end of the day. Children are asked to leave their certificates with their non-animal entries until the end of the day so everyone can celebrate your success! It also helps the Judges know which entries still need to be judged.

- Please remember, entries are to be the children's efforts, not that of the parents.
- Children must not leave the grounds without permission.
- Ponies must be kept in their own area.
- Parents: we encourage you to stay out of the building while the judging is going on as this helps to speed up the process and allows the rest of the day to keep on track.
- · Please note: Children do not wear their uniform to Pet Day. This has caused confusion in the past.
- The Wyndham A & P Show committee welcome entries from children for the up and coming Wyndham The A & P Show will be held at the Wyndham Show grounds on the 6/12/25. Further information can be obtained at the Secretary's office.
- There will be some form of entertainment/demonstration/display around the theme of the Pet Day.
- A programme and layout map of where entries, toilets and Secretary's office are located will be available as
- Pet Day officially ends after the Grand Parade.

#### **HELPFUL INFORMATION:**

- wear mufti (not school uniform) gumboots are highly recommended
- don't come to school at all
- caregivers/adults to supervise kids
- arrive at the Wyndham A&P showgrounds with your entries prior to judging at 10am
- non-pet entries need to be labelled with; student name, year level and school
- get your pet entry judged first and then go to the location of your non-pet entries for judging
- free sausage sizzle for kids at lunch time
- you are free to leave once your judging is finished


