Principal's Update

As you will be aware it is School Board Election time and it was great to see seven people nominated for the four available parent representative places on our Board. Before you vote, please take a few minutes to read these statements which were sent with voting papers.

Congratulations to our hardworking Deputy Principal and Kahikatea teacher Hayley Clarke who will again be our WPS Staff representative on the Board. Taking on this important role is an excellent opportunity for a staff member to learn more about the statutory responsibilities of a School Board and about the distinction between "management" and "governance". Hayley brings a whole school view to everything she does at WPS and contributes thoughtfully to our governance team, well done Hayley.

As Principal, my role is akin to that of a Chief Executive – responsible for the operations of the school, the day to day management of staff, resources and facilities as well a being a full member of the school's Board. The Principal implements the strategic plan of the Board (who themselves represent the aims and aspirations of the school community) while following statutory guidelines, supporting students, whānau and staff wellbeing and ensuring quality teaching and learning. Without the backing of a cohesive and committed school Board many schools have seen achievement, attendance and staff morale drop. A strong and respectful partnership between Board and Principal is therefore essential in any school.

Over my three and a half years here I can happily say that the outgoing Board provided me with excellent support as we have worked together to make WPS the thriving school and workplace it is today. I look forward to working alongside the next Board as we continue to *Aim High* together for our students, staff and Wyndham community.





All games will be played at Archer Basketball Stadium, Avon Street, Gore.



Teams will be as follows:
Year 5&6 boys will play on Monday
Year 5&6 girls will play on Tuesday
Year 3&4 mixed will play on Wednesday



Subs are \$50 per person.

The 2025 miniball season will start on 8th September and will run for 10 weeks. (2 weeks before the school holidays and 8 weeks after the school holidays, NO GAMES DURING THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS)

The Monday competition will go for an extra week because of Labour Day.

The first week is a grading week and that is where we also combine kids from schools that don't have enough kids to form a full team.

We recommend having around 8 kids in the teams but no more than 9. Games will be 10 minute halves with a 1.5 minute break with 10 minutes of skills before the game.

We ask that every team has a referee. This can be a parent or a high school student, maybe a sibling to a player.


